<p>Project: Using objects in your home complete a gray scale that goes from white to black. You can use any objects you want, piece of paper, article of clothing, a toy you might have had from your childhood to create the scale. Arrange the objects from lightest to darkest in a straight line. You can overlap objects, crop them out of the frame or fold them back as necessary to get as even of a transition as possible. We are asking that Art 1 students use a MINIMUM of 11 objects (one black, one white and 9 gray objects) and Art 2 students use 16 objects (one white, one black and 14 gray objects).</p> <p>Grayscale: a range of gray shades from white to black, as used in a monochrome display or printout. *Value is another way we speak about grayscale*</p> <p>Remember our full value drawings? Using a full range of gray tones to create the illusion of form. The objects you choose should be varied from white/light gray to dark charcoal/black.</p>
