

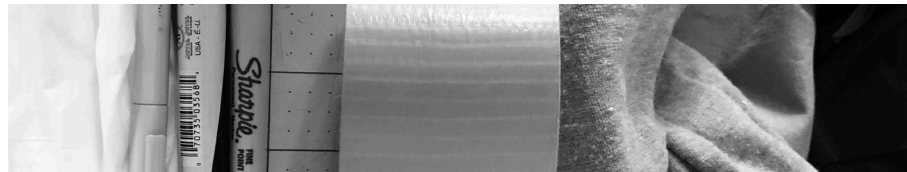

Assignment: Using (11) found objects create a grayscale

Value is one of the seven elements of art. Value is defined as how light or dark something is, and is used in drawing to depict light and shadow. The value scale is a tool used to organize and measure colors from light to dark. For this assignment we are going to focus on a grayscale.

A **grayscale** consists of a range from white to black, with several shades of gray in between. The shades of gray do not have any apparent color.



PRO TIPS:

1. YOU CAN TAKE THE PHOTO AND THEN ADJUST THE SETTINGS TO BLACK AND WHITE.
2. IF YOU'RE HAVING A HARD TIME SEEING WHAT VALUE AN OBJECT IS, SQUINT YOUR EYES
3. YOU MAY HAVE TO TAKE SEVERAL PICTURES TO MAKE SURE YOUR VALUES ARE IN THE CORRECT ORDER

How to submit your work:

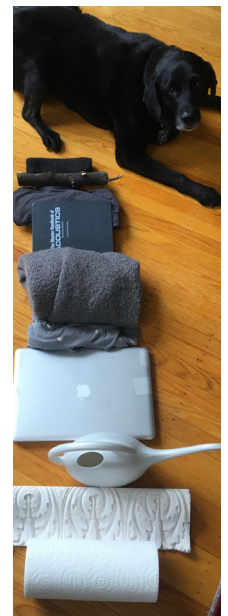
